Those that are less important were terminated and funding moved to top priorities. It was difficult to close projects that had good science. In some cases, scientists and staff were redirected to other programs.

8	Station Reports and Updates - All (The NERA Executive Committee believes the individual station updates are important and useful, however we are recommending that we limit both the time spent on this activity, and focus on the discussion. As such, the Executive Committee recommends that each station spend no more than 3 minutes providing a report, and that the focus be on the FY12-13 state budget situation and what the stations are expecting in funding, positions, etc. Each reporting station is asked to provide a 'best guess' analysis of how the station, the university and higher education is expected to fare in their individual FY12-13 legislative sessions.)
	Note: The Northeast Pasteur Consortium is seeking support for their annual Research/Extension/Stakeholder meeting. ARS provides \$20K but may not be sufficient to cover speakers and travel for farmers. Dr. Rossi suggested that the NPC group put together a proposal for discussion at the summer meeting. Other alternative sources may be available, such as the NIFA grants for conferences.

The funding requested is to support the Northeastern Regional Center for Rural Development.

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The NRSP requests for off-the-top were discussed, and the Directors agreed with the amounts requested for NRSPs 1-3-6-7-8 as these amounts equal those that were originally approved in the 5-year budget proposal.
There were questions as to whether NRSP4 and NRSP9 were able to raise funding from other sources which was the condition set when they were approved for funding last year. The technical committees were able to demonstrate good effort in securing other funding but fell short of the target. The NRSP requests will be voted on at the Sept. ESS meeting.
NRSP_temp261 ipmPIPE proposal was re-submitted with a better articulation of the research component, but still heavy on extension. How will the database be used for research? We want to encourage extension participation, but they do not have the same off-the-top mechanism and in the long-term need to share resources if they want to be equal partners in multistate activities.
 Action: A motion was made, seconded and passed, that NERA will not support the NRSP_temp261 ipmPIPE proposal for the following reasons: Lack of viable funding plan – there should be other sources of funding No relevance to the Northeast Unclear on the nature of the data and how it will be collected Extension driven. There should be clear objectives for both research and extension. Dr. Stafford III will bring these concerns to the NRSP Review Committee.
 2012 National Multistate Research Award NE1025 will be re-submitted as this year's Northeast nomination. Dr. Rhodes will be contacted.
