Action items:

- The notes for the September 22, 2020 NERA business meeting are posted. Check them out!

The ESS budget, as presented, was approved. ESS budget-related items that are remain unresolved include: the 2021 ESS assessment and approval/rejection of the CMC's request for ESS support. We'll stay on top of those and will apprise when action is needed from you.
