• Hold the date: the <u>2024 BAA Summer Leadership Meeting</u> (formerly known as Joint COPS) will be held in Providence, RI on July 16-18, 2024. During this meeting, agInnovation will host a hybrid business session on July 16 from 8:30 AM – 11:45 AM ET.

Informational items:

• South Dakota State University's Agricultural Experiment Station is seeking an innovative <u>Manager of Foundation Seed Stock</u> to lead their dedicated team in shaping the future of agriculture. This position is

located in Brookings, South Dakota and is a 12-month, full-time, benefits-eligible position.

- The American Samoa Community College, a U.S. Land-grant institution, invites applications for a full-time <u>Forestry Researcher</u>. The position is a two-year contract, renewable upon satisfactory performance, and housed within the College's Agriculture, Community and Natural Resources Division. Responsibilities include both research and extension (non-formal education), as well as support for the College's instructional programs.
- And again: The U.S. Global Change Research Program (USGCRP) has issued a national call for authors, public comment, and technical inputs for the Sixth National Climate Assessment (NCA6).
