- Thank you for casting a ballot on the <u>FY2025 NERA budget</u>. Twelve ballots were cast out of a possible 14 for an 86% response rate. The motion to approve passed by a count of 11-approve, 1-reject. To that end, we will be preparing the 2025 NERA invoices in the next several weeks.


Informational items:
