1. Call to Order - Chair Goodwin

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 pm.

2. Comments from the Members (States/stations Updates) - Chair Goodwin Each member gave a brief summary of administrative and budget issues in their institutions and states.

5. Interim Actions by the Chair and NERA Executive Committee Report - Chair Goodwin Actions Taken by NERA Chair

Review of Joint Session discussion and issues:

There is potential for greater collaboration on the renewable energy issues raised in the Joint Session discussions. The institutions in the Northeast are already engaged in research activities but the scientists are not working together. It may be worthwhile to have an inventory of ongoing projects and scientists involved. We can create a mechanism in which these scientists can collaborate, not artificially removing competition, but at least they are aware of what others are doing and are not duplicating efforts. We need to go after the 'big picture' addressing all aspects of bioenergy, set up a consortium and go after funds as a region. Switchgrass, for example, is unique in the Northeast. Concentrate on what Northeast needs - biological and economic aspects. Institutions are gearing up for competition and are opening faculty positions, it is imperative that we approach this as a region so we can share and maximize resources.

The Northeast Sun Grant is a good starting point for building up the inventory. Mike Hoffman will confer with Larry Walker, Northeast Sun Grant Director.

6. CSREES Update - Anna Palmisano

Dr. Anna Palmisano gave a brief update on CSREES.

- Farm Bill update: House Agriculture Committee Chair Collin Peterson, D-Minn. plans to bring two versions of the farm bill to the full committee after the Fourth of July recess. One, extending the current law and the other allocating \$20 billion reserve fund for various farm programs.
- FY2008 Budget: NRI will see an increase in the President's budget. 406 money will be moved to NRI, about 40M-45M for administrative purposes. About 19M-22M is for bioenergy, focussed on sustainablity environmental and impacts on communities.
- One Solution update: Dr. Greg Crosby has been holding teleconferences on One Solution reporting system. Ultimately, One Solution will be used for data mining. The directors were concerned that the experiment station system had no representation or input in the development of the reporting system. Dr. A. Palmisano will ask Dr. Greg Crosby to give a One Solution update at the ESS Meeting, September 16-19, in Philadelphia. Drs. Rossi and McPheron will work on the schedule to include the One Solution update. Dr. Palmisano will inform Dr. Crosby.

7. NERCRD Report - Stephan Goetz

The committee can re-submit their request if they can differentiate this proposal from NCERA125 and demonstrate the need for establishing a Northeast multistate project.

14. Chair and ED Report from Meeting with CARET

CARET had passed a motion to move forward to the next steps as discussed in the Joint Session. A working group to pursue activities on the bioenergy topic will be formed with representatives from NERA, NEED and CARET. CARET appointed Hank Clark (VT) as member and Bob Frazee (MD) as alternate to this group. A representative from an 1890 institution in the Northeast will also be invited.

Dr. Mike Hoffman and Dr. Bradley Hillman will be the members from NERA. The NERA-OED will provide administrative support to the working group and will facilitate its first meeting. An inventory of Northeast strengths and capacity in bioenergy will be compiled. Dr. Hillman noted that there are already resources at Rurgers that he can tap into. Dr. Hoffman will confer with Larry Walker at Sun Grant. This group will collaborate closely with the NE Sun Grant Initiative. The focus of this group will be on conservation and other forms of alternative sources of renewable energy, and not just biofuels. We should be able to demonstrate that we can capitalize on our advantage to work as a region.
