The development of the land-grant institutions, in contrast, created a "moral force" that opened the doors to all comers, with a basis on ability and effort instead of affluence and social networks."

- During the NERA Business Meeting, we had a discussion with Erica Mirich, the consultant that helped to develop the re-branding of the Experiment Station Section to agInnovation. (See the first Reminder/Update.) You'll see in the minutes of June 7, that the NERA directors asked Rick to explore a name change for our organization: from NERA to agInnovation/Northeast. Reminders/Updates:

- The new website for <u>aglnnovation</u> (formerly called the Experiment Station Section) is up and running. Check it out, it's who we are now.
- One of the items that will be discussed at the agInnovation Executive Committee (also known as ESCOP) meeting at Joint COPS is a <u>report from an ad-hoc committee</u> recommending the formation of an agInnovation 501(c)3 foundation. Rick served on the ad hoc committee and supports the formation of the new organization.

Informational items:

- The 2023 Joint COPs Summer Meeting is scheduled for July 18, 2023 July 20, 2023, at the Loew's Kansas City Hotel, Kansas City, MO. As a heads up, the <u>New Administrator's Orientation</u> is being held concurrently with Joint COPS. Today is the last day to take advantage of the <u>group room rate</u> (\$219 + tax).
- Hold the date: The annual meeting of agInnovation (formerly known as the Experiment Station Section) is scheduled for September 24-26 in Grand Rapids, MI. The theme for the meeting is **Catalyzing Solutions to Climate Change Impacts on Food Security through Partnerships**.
- Continuing: The National Science Foundation (NSF) requests input to inform the development of a roadmap for its newly established Technology, Innovation, and Partnerships (TIP) Directorate, in accordance with the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022.
