## Action items:

• As we have discussed, the National Impact Database Subcommittee is seeking reviewers to evaluate and provide impact statement writers with feedback. Each region (5) was to submit the names of 6 reviewers (3 from CE, 3 from AES) for a total of 30 reviewers. As we've shared previously, NERA has had modest (and decreasing) participation with the National Impact Database over the past three years. Are there any stations that are willing to name a reviewer? If so, please provide me with a name and email address, I'll share that with Karla Trautman (a co-chair of the NIDB Subcommittee.) These reviewers could be evaluating statements from other regions or disciplines (AES or CE.)

• Second ask: NEED is seeking examples from institutions that have had successful student-sharing programs (students from your institution participate in another institution's academic programs at no extra cost to your students). This could be either face-to-face or virtual. <u>Please forward examples to me, I'll</u> assemble and share with Ali Mitchell.

We'll circulate a draft of the written comments prior to the final comment submission due date on November 30, 2018.
