

The Spring meeting is just 7 weeks away; don't hesitate to register!

Action items:

- The votes are in from the electronic ballot sent on December 21st. 10 of 15 stations cast a vote. Issues that were addressed on the ballot included:
 - · Ian Maw nomination for Northeast ESS Leadership Award.
 - Motion passes by simple majority
 - Rules of operation, change #1, reduce the number of NE stations from 15 to 14 (consolidate Cornell – Ithaca and Cornell NYSAES – Geneva).
 - Motion passes by 2/3 majority
 - Rules of operation, change #2, eliminate nomination committee.
 - Motion passes by 2/3 majority
 - Rules of operation, change #3, minor editorial corrections.
 - Motion passes by 2/3 majority
- The Spring meeting has a reading assignment and a reflection opportunity. The reading assignment is to peruse Bruce Tulgan's Not Everyone Gets a Trophy (Revised and Updated How to Manage Millennials.) It's available on Amazon (\$13.00 for Kindle edition, \$15.30 for hardcover or \$7.95 for paperback) and will be the backbone of a best practices conversation on "Managing millennials: new students, new staff, new faculty." Jan also asks that you reflect on how you use discretionary funding. We'll be doing a best practices session on using discretionary funding to support faculty and staff development. So, here are the points to ponder. The deployment of discretionary funds (any funds state, federal, foundation or other that can be used for a purpose that you deem necessary) can be a powerful tool for assisting faculty and staff development. We ask that you consider the following discussion questions:
 - Do you have discretionary funds?
 - If you do have access to discretionary funds, what is the primary source of the funds?
 - Have you used those funds to assist faculty and staff development?
 - If yes, please provide examples of those best practices.
 - If no, what are the primary uses of your discretionary funds?
 - If you don't have access to discretionary funds, are there strategies that you might deploy to seek and secure those funds?
