- NERA is meeting on Thursday, December 15, 8:30-10:00 AM ET. The <u>agenda</u> and supporting materials (<u>MAC report and multistate proposals</u>) are posted on the NERA website. We look forward to seeing you on-line!
- We've heard from the North Central region that the guidance coming from NIFA about financial reporting of competitive grants programs has been confusing and inconsistent. In short, the issue revolves around the Terms and Conditions of Competitive Grants which state that a financial report is due on February 1, 2023. Apparently, NIFA is sending notices that indicate that financial reports are due within 120 days after the project end date. We're interested in hearing if this is causing indigestion among your business officers.

## Reminders/Updates:

- While in DC on behalf of the Experiment Station Section and the Cooperative Extension Section, we visited with Hubert Hamer, the Administrator of the National Agricultural Statistics Service. He sought our help (ag experiment stations and Cooperative Extension) in encouraging producers to respond to the <a href="2022 Census of Agriculture">2022 Census of Agriculture</a>. The deadline for responding to the census is February 6, 2023. NASS has posted <a href="2005 top partners to promote the census">2005 top partners to promote the census</a>.
- You might remember that Wendie Cohick shared a <u>presentation</u> in Baltimore on the agrivoltaic program at Rutgers. On December 8, the Department of Energy announced the winners of the FARMS

(Foundational Agrivoltaic Research for Megawatt Scale) funding program. Rutgers was awarded \$1.6 million.
