## Action items:

- A NERA work session titled "COVID and Finance Workarounds" moderated by Jody Jellison and Eric Wommack is scheduled for tomorrow, October 20, at 9:00-10:00 AM ET. The discussion will explore workarounds on both the revenue and expense sides of the ledger.
- There are several virtual meetings that we want to bring to your attention. These are associated with the Annual APLU meeting but do not require you to register for the APLU meeting. While each of the sessions that follow require registration, the registration is free.
- 1. On October 28, the APLU is hosting their annual awards ceremony "A Community of Scholars Celebrating Excellence: CES and ESS Awards Presentation and Seaman A. Knapp Memorial Lecture." This event celebrates both Extension and Experiment Station Awards and requires registration (which is free.) Adel Shirmohammadi will be receiving the Northeast's Excellence in Leadership Award.
- 2. The ESCOP Executive Committee is holding a session on October 27 from 1:00-3:30 PM ET. Registration is required and is free.
- 3. The Board on Agriculture Assembly (BAA) Business Meeting is meeting on November 12 from 3:30-5:30 PM ET. Registration is required and is free.

• We will be circulating an Experiment Station Section ballot shortly. (This is a follow up item from the last newsletter and ESS Meeting.) There will be three items on the ballot. The first item is an ask from the CMC seeking \$100,000 per section (Administrative Heads, Cooperative Extension and the Experiment Station) for two years to support dedicated staff to run the communications and marketing project. As your Executive Director, I recommend approval. The other two ballot items relate to the Experiment Station Section assessment. Of those, one item is strictly editorial: renaming the ESS assessment from the CMC Assessment to the Annual Assessment. I recommend approval. The third ballot issue revolves around the ESS assessment. You will be given a choice to suspend the assessment for two years or reduce the assessment for two years (i.e., reduce the annual assessment from its current level of \$200,000 to \$100,000.) You'll see in materials associated with the ballot, that the Experiment Station Section can absorb the suspension of the assessment through use of carryover funds and tapping a cash reserve account (if needed). The rub on this ballot item is that passage of one of the two choices must be by a 2/3 majority. Based on the financial news that I've heard from the region, I recommend suspending the assessment.

- For the first time in its 133-year history, the APLU Annual Meeting will be held virtually, from November 9-11, 2020. The theme for the meeting is "Resilience and Equity", here's the link to <u>register</u>. As an APLU member, registration is \$45.
