Action items:

- If you'd like to flip some pages, the Office of Management and Budget has released The President's Budget. You'll see on page 46 of the "Budget of the U.S. Government" that the summary tables identify \$40 billion to be allocated over a period of ten years for investing in R&D, including upgrading and funding America's research infrastructure. The system still needs congressional champions, but this is a high level placeholder for campus infrastructure investments. Last, the release of the President's budget officially starts the appropriations season. More to come.
- Continue to hold the date: Hold the date for the Virtual Joint NEED/NERA/CARET/AHS summer meeting. Here's the framework that the Executive Committees of NEED and NERA agreed upon:
