• The Center for Tropical and Subtropical Aquaculture (CTSA, University of Hawaii) is hosting a discussion on "Funding for Regional Aquaculture Centers (RACs)" on Wednesday, March 16, 2022, 9am – 10am Hawaii-Aleutian Time (2-3 pm ET; 1-2 pm CT; 12-1 pm MT; 11am-12pm PT). While the five RACS are viewed as important and relevant resources for the diversified nationwide aquaculture industry, funding for the RACs is one of the small lines in the NIFA budget and frequently zeroed in the President's budget.  The College of Agricultural, Human, and Natural Resource Sciences (CAHNRS) at Washington State University (WSU) Tri-Cities Campus seeks a visionary and distinguished leader to be <u>Founding Chair</u> of the newly established Department of Viticulture and Enology.

 The Agricultural Research Service-USDA seeks a <u>Supervisory Research Plant Physiologist/Geneticist</u> (<u>Plants</u>)/<u>Agricultural Engineer</u> to serve as the Research Leader for the Plant Physiology & Genetics Research Unit of the Arid-Land Agricultural Research Center in Maricopa, AZ.

NIFA has released the <u>RFA for the Organic Agriculture Research and Extension Initiative</u> (OREI).
OREI is particularly interested in projects that emphasize research, education and outreach that assist farmers and ranchers with whole farm planning by delivering practical research-based information.
There's \$30M in the funding pool and awards are expected to range from \$50K to \$3M. Applications are due on March 31, 2022.

• The USDA intends to invest \$1B to support climate smart activities. The new <u>Partnerships for Climate-Smart Commodities</u> will finance pilot projects that create market opportunities for U.S. agricultural and forestry products that use climate-smart practices and include innovative, cost-effective ways to measure and verify greenhouse gas benefits. The USDA is now accepting project applications <u>here</u> for fiscal year 2022.

• Please hold June 5-7, 2022, on your calendar in anticipation of the NEED/NERA Joint Summer Meeting at the Portland Regency in Portland, ME.

• And again, plenty of time: The University of Tennessee will be hosting the <u>2nd U.S. Precision</u> <u>Livestock Farming Conference (USPLF 2023)</u> scheduled for **May 21 – 24, 2023** in Knoxville, TN. The conference theme is *Field Implementation of PLF*. Abstract submission will open on May 15, 2022, and papers are sought in the following topic areas: Sensors and Sensing in PLF; Data Management and Algorithm Development; Measuring, Modeling, and Managing of Dynamic Responses; and Societal Impacts of PLF.
